

Read Cover Write Check




Look at the information you want to remember.

Write it out. Check that what you wrote is correct.

Flashcards



Create a set of flashcards. Questions on the front and answers on the back.

Repeatedly quiz yourself on the content. Repeatedly redo any cards that you get wrong.

Brain Dump





Write down everything you can remember about a topic. You could use a list or mind map.

Compare this to class notes, a revision guide or your previous work on the topic.

Quizzing




Create your own quiz to complete or take some of the online quizzes (SPARX, SENECA, BBC bitesize).

Repeat these quizzes.


Exam Questions
