Revision and Support FAQs

What can I do to help my child to revise?

- Try to provide a quiet space, free from distractions such as mobile phones, younger siblings and TV.
- Encourage them to begin as soon as possible, with smaller chunks of revision (10-30 minutes) and 5-10 minute breaks.
- Set clear, realistic goals 30 minutes per evening to start with, building up in time.
- Between mock exams, teacher-set home learning will take time and may also include revision – help them to stay organised by checking their planner and Microsoft Teams each day after school.

What is the best way to revise?

We will support pupils in lessons with correct revision techniques. Like all skills, revision takes practice! The following hints and tips are a great starting point, and a revision skills presentation is included in the emails with this document for further details:

Do

- Whatever you're working on, *test yourself* then check and improve your work. Flash cards, practice questions, matching words and definitions, knowledge organisers & memory maps work well.
- Make a revision plan. Set a routine to revise, ideally earlier in the day not when tired. Immediately after school is ideal.
- Spread time evenly between topics, starting with those that you find hardest.
- Always contact your teaching if you are struggling in class, using Teams or by email.

Don't

- Just copy key information it's not effective without testing yourself.
- Try to multi-task hide your phone so notifications don't distract you.
- Listen to music if you absolutely must because you don't have a quiet place, make sure it doesn't have lyrics. Revision / study playlists exist for that purpose.
- Revise late at night or stay up late you will remember more if you are more alert and get good quality sleep. Sleep is REALLY important!

English

English Language topics to revise:

Students will sit a full Language Paper 2 in the second round of mocks. The best revision source is their exercise book which contains lots of teacher-led modelled writing.

Students should ask themselves the following questions when reading and responding to unseen sources:

- How does the writer use language to achieve certain effects and how is this similar/different across the sources?
- How do writers convey their attitudes and feelings?
- How do writers position us as readers: do they let us into their thoughts or do they keep us at a distance?

Students might also engage in creative writing activities to revise for Section B and should structure their writing using the Question 5 framework we have used in lessons.

English Literature topics to revise:

Students will respond to *Romeo and Juliet* and *A Christmas Carol* in this round of mocks. For all texts, they should use the revision materials we provide and make notes on:

- How the texts open and with what tone/style.
- Where the major shift points are in the text and why.
- How the text closes. Here they should explore if the tone has shifted from the start and whether the 'voice/character' in the narrative undergone change.
- What major messages the writers are sending through their texts

This will be retrieval-based homework covering key topics that will appear on the February mocks. Your support in ensuring this compulsory homework is completed on a weekly basis is greatly appreciated.

Students can continue to log into Sparx to complete revision if they wish.

After School Revision

Maths revision takes place after school every Wednesday, recommencing Wednesday 8th January. This will take place in their usual maths classrooms with their maths teacher (3:15-4pm). This intervention is available to all students and we strongly recommend full attendance to these useful sessions.

To help students focus their revision at home, each topic has been linked to a Sparx independent learning code and a page from the OCR exam practice workbook.
